This poet primarily focuses on campaigning for needs, unity, and consensus among individuals, protecting the rights of the marginalized and suffering, while addressing societal challenges. The poet's dedication and passion for public demands and social movements are evident in his works. While poetry and literature have traditionally addressed a range of social and political themes, many poets have focused primarily on social issues and societal concerns in their writings. Abdul Bar is an eminent poet whose oeuvre possesses international significance. Abdul Bar Johann, a distinguished historical poet, was born in Kandahar, where he acquired the principles of science and literature. His international poetry holds significant value within the historical context of poetry, particularly on social issues. He was among the pioneering authors to meticulously analyze social guilds. Political and social issues have emerged that, alongside conveying thoughts and messages, also address the literary and artistic tastes of the public (Rekhteen, 1982). A collective poetry lacking lyrical and creative merit merely becomes a slogan, failing to fulfill the literary and artistic aspirations of the audience.
